IRISH WHISKEY

Happy St. Patty's Day! In honour of the beauty of Ireland and the traditions of good quality spirits, we are pleased to bring to you a taste of some of our favourite Irish Whiskeys.

POWERS GOLD LABEL

Powers Gold Label is cut from the best parts of the grain to distill this whiskey. Left to mature in selected American Oak, bold spice and flavour is infused into this wonderful spirit. On the Nose, you will find Cinnamon, clove oil and white pepper perfectly balanced with ripe pears and russet apples. This develops on the palate into cinnamon, green peppers and a hint of nutmeg, combined with orchard fruits, vanilla and toasted oak.

TULLAMORE D.E.W. - Caribbean Rum Cask

Established in 1829 Tullamore, County Offaly, this whisky is now the second largest selling brand of Irish whiskey. Gaining its first claim to fame under the watchful eye of Daniel E. Williams, his influence on the brand became forever immortalized with his initials D.E.W. Production ceased however in 1954, when Prohibition, Anglo-Irish Trade War,

and high taxation introduced by the Irish Free State caused sales to dwindle. Now Tullamore D.E.W. has returned to the world stage with a new distillery and production site in Tullamore.

The Complex yet approachable flavours in the whiskey are derived from three types of grain, triple distillation, and the blend of three Irish Whiskeys. These three spirits come together to give a balance of flavour with Grain Whiskey providing sweetness, Malt Whiskey embellishing fruitiness, and Pot Still Whiskey lending natural spiciness. Aged in previously used Demerara Casks known for imparting a distinctive tropical fruit flavour, Tullamore D.E.W. XO Caribbean Rum Cask Finish pays tribute to the role of Irish Immigrants in the development of rum in the Caribbean in the 17th Century. Irish heart and Caribbean soul.

GREEN SPOT - Single Pot Still Irish Whiskey

Green Spot was originally produced exclusively for the Mitchell family who, commenced trading in 1805 on 10 Grafton St. in the heart of Dublin city as purveyors of fine wines and confectionary. Four generations later, the company is still in the wine and spirits business, under the stewardship of Jonathan Mitchell and his son Robert. The Mitchell family expanded into whiskey bonding in 1887, whereby they sent empty wine, sherry and port casks via horse and cart to the local Jameson Distillery, which were then filled and returned to the Mitchell's cellar warehouse. There, the whiskeys matured for many years under bond until they were ready to be bottled and sold.

Green Spot is a non-age statement Single Pot Still Irish Whiskey comprising of pot still whiskeys aged between 7 and 10 years. The whiskey has matured in a combination of new bourbon and refill bourbon casks as well as sherry casks. On the Nose, you will find fresh aromatic oils and spices with orchard fruits and barley on a background of toasted wood. The palate is full and spicy, with hints of cloves, green apples, and a rounding off of toasted oak.
